Letter From the President

Dear Brothers:

The events of September 11, 2001, shocked, angered, and refocused our lives as few others have. Being on "the street" for as long as I have, the tragedy in the financial district struck particularly close to home. A number of my friends were lost or are still missing. The entire Alumni House Corporation and I offer our sympathy and support to those who are in similar situations to my own.

It was the loss of friends that has stayed with me daily since the attacks. My own refocus is on my family and friends – more hugs for the kids, an extra kiss for my wife, extra visits to my mother who now lives close by, and harder work as Alumni Corporation President at preserving and improving our chapter at Penn State.

I have tremendously good news since my last letter to you. We have thus far raised over \$36,000 in our fundraising efforts. This enabled us to pay the back taxes (we still owe our present bill), catch up the mortgage, pay the fire insurance bill, and start to pay off the outstanding balance with the International Fraternity. We had funds to begin long overdue repairs to our beloved chapter house. Gutters and fascia boards were fixed, bathroom problems were corrected (minor ones; however, major ones to follow), water-damaged areas were fixed, the exterior locks were replaced, and the fire code violations were remedied.

On the non-financial front, we have set up an alumni advisory board (an alumni advisor for each active officer), expanded the house corporation board to its full staff of 17, hired an outside CPA firm to collect and disburse funds, started a preliminary structural study of the house, set up alumni events at every home game, negotiated a very favorable matching payment plan with the international fraternity, created a new alumni website, begun to publish the *Zephyr* quarterly, created budgets and cash flow analysis statements, and have directly worked with the active chapter on maintenance of the house.

There is still much to do, and we need your help more than ever. The hot water tank failed after 16 years. As I said before, the bathrooms need major repairs. The exterior needs to be painted. The kitchen range, a resident of 30 years, is no longer repairable. The downstairs floors need refinishing immediately. We need new curtains as well as another freezer. I could go on, but for now these are the most pressing items.

The main reason that so much is needed so soon is that we should have overcapacity in the house next year. The actives' fall rush campaign was the largest on campus: 24 new associates joined us last September. For perspective, 700 bids went out from 55 fraternities on campus. You do the math. It was an outstanding job by our active brothers! It is getting better, but we do need your support now. We estimate that we still need \$45,000 for various plans and that does not address the long-term issue of significantly paying down our mortgage. We are attempting to increase cash flow through refinancing the debt, but we would like to refinance a smaller amount than we currently have.

I'll ask again, but first let me thank all who have already donated funds. Come back, tour the house, meet the actives, and see your old friends. Do it now! As recent history has tragically proven to me, there are no guarantees for another opportunity.
