Was a Scene in Animal House Based Off of a Party at Lambda Chi? Ed Stoloski '70 Recalls his Best Zeta Zeta Memories and How He Stays Active Today

Thank you to Ed Stoloski '70 for participating in this Q&A.

What is the funniest memory from your Lambda Chi days? One of my great memories is from a party that we had at our house with two other fraternities. We hired a band, Leroy Taylor, from Washington, D.C. The party was outstanding and the band was playing tons of R&B and MoTown including the song, "Shout." While they were playing "Shout," all of the brothers fell to the floor and started a dance they call the "turtle," which consisted of twisting and turning all over the floor; this dance was common at parties with bands. Years later the movie Animal House came out and the exact same scene took place in the movie with an identical band and all of the brothers doing the turtle on the floor. During the weeks that the movie first came out, many of the former brothers during that time called me and said,
