• Starting in 1993, Lambda Chi Alpha began to the North American Food

Drive, the largest single-day fraternity philanthropic project at the time.

- Lambda Chi was the third fraternity to initiate over 200,000 in the year 1991.
- During WWI, 90% of Lambda Chi members were in war service with six Zetas turning inactive.
- About 1,000 brothers and guests attended the International Centennial Celebration held on July 31, 2009.
- The first fraternity quarters was located in Boston at 16 Westlake Avenue.
